NOTES: 1. These columns show authorized training categories and pay groups. The following apply:

a. Training Category A:

(1) Members of units organized to serve as units in event of mobilization must attend 48 UTAs each fiscal year. These units must schedule at least one multiple drill each month (2 UTAs in 1 day) except for the month before and after the ANACDUTRA. Members perform ANACDUTRA and INACDUTRA as unit training unless otherwise authorized by chapters 16 and 17 or ANGRS 50-02 and 50-03.

(2) Mobilization augmentees who must meet flying proficiency requirements of AFM 60-1, and members of units not organized to serve as units (includes Air Force Reserve Regions) must attend 24 TPs in each half fiscal year.

b. Training Category B. Mobilization augmentees must attend 12 TPs each half fiscal year.

c. All Training Categories. The commander may authorize credit for any AD training tour toward the INACDUTRA requirement in the half fiscal year in which AD was performed. One day of AD equals one TP. Exception. An ANACDUTRA tour or tour performed instead of it may not be so credited.

2. The minimum duration of required INACDUTRA periods is prescribed in chapter 15 and the note to paragraphs 20-7b(1) and (2) (for USAFR) and ANGR 50-02 (for ANGUS).

3. Includes military and tactical airlift units, military airlift (associate) units, tactical air support units, special operations units, aerospace rescue and recovery squadrons, aerial port squadrons, censorship squadrons, mobile maintenance support squadrons, supply support squadrons, military airlift support squadrons (mobile enroute), air postal and courier units, aeromedical airlift (associate) units, aeromedical evacuation units, and medical service units.

4. Exclusive of authorized travel time.

5. When initially approving training for mobilization augmentees at activities that normally do not operate on Saturday and Sunday, approving officials will insure that members are not required to report before the date training is to begin and that they will be released promptly after scheduled training is completed.

6. Tour of ACDUTRA for OJT at activities that normally do not operate on week-ends will be limited to 12 days, that is, from Monday of the first week through Friday of the second week. However, if valuable training opportunities are available and are so stated in AF Form 1289, the remarks section, when initially approving the training, members will be ordered to ACDUTRA for 14 days.

7. Members who are qualified for retirement under AFM 35-7, chapter 9, except for having reached age 60, must attain a minimum of 50 points (including gratuitous points) each retention/retirement year. This training requirement may be excused on a one-time basis under paragraph 11-18 and table 11-1.

8. Consists of nonprior service enlistees delayed from entering initial ACDUTRA, and USAF Academy Preparatory School selectees.

9. Members selected to participate in special training programs authorized by regulation, for example, Academy Liason, CHAPAR, USAFLO, JAGAR, etc.

10. Includes members with an MSO who have served on EAD for one or more days and those with an active duty service commitment.

11. Consists of members transferred from the Ready Reserve to the Standby Reserve because of being members of Congress or key Federal employees, and who volunteer for assignment to the active status Standby Reserve. They may remain in this category as long as they are Congressmen or designated as key Federal employees.

12. Paragraph 13-4 lists those eligible to participate and paragraph 19-2 lists retention requirements.
